REMINDER: The Park has rules, as does LFR. These camping rules have been sent out to each person attending camp and are expected to be read. If you need a copy for your reference please contact lakesidefrontieriders@gmail.com and request a copy.

There were a few etiquette/rules violations at camp this time. One in particular was the emptying of water buckets upon departure of camp. Please DO NOT empty your water buckets in your corrals or in such a way that it runs down into other corrals. If you need help with getting your bucket out to empty it, please ask for help. The water should be emptied so that it runs down the road or in a place that avoids entering another corral. Also suggested that if you are leaving, only fill the bucket half way.

Also the water cistern in the back loop should be left with some water in it for the wildlife that comes into camp after we leave.

Also discussed was special cases of the difference between a day rider and members riding a horse already at camp for the owner? Opinions ranged from something should be paid; if the corral is paid for, then no charge for a 3rd member riding that horse. It was suggested that membership think on it and decide at the next meeting. TRAILS REPORTS:

Old Survey Rd 97 Ride (Ramona): There is a decent led ride for riding in this area behind the Grasslands in Ramona. This is an area that is not currently open to the public but in possibly in the future plans to be open for riding, hiking, etc. There are some Golden Eagle issues that still need to be worked out with the County Parks before that can happen. Meanwhile they are offering certain days for decent led hikes and rides scheduled for different weekends.

October 21 is for the hiking and October 28th and November 11th are the two equestrian openings for this year. The spaces are limited to 15 people and you will need to call the Parks reservation line to sign up. Apparently the on-line sign up is not currently working. The number is 858-565-3600.

It was suggested that we as equestrians need to go on these rides to show that we are interested in having this area available to us as additional trails, open for public access. You cannot be late for this ride as the gate is locked after the group passes through.

The decent rides are now a lollipop ride instead of out/in ride. It was suggested by Kammi M that we make the decent ride a club ride for 15 riders for Jan/Feb. 2018.

Any other trails reports? Backcountry Horsemen urge equestrians to email Duncan Hunter "NO" on HR1349. HR1349 opens the wilderness trails to bikes, strollers, wheelchairs, etc.
